


Fun days out for all the family

Windermere is the perfect place for a great day out. There is so much to see by bike, bus, boot or boat. So leave the car at the hotel or car park, and start exploring!

For a truly memorable day for all the family, try one of these itineraries. From excitable toddlers to adventurous teens, there's sure to be something for everyone.

Bikes and Sun All-weather Attractions











Bikes and Boats from the Lake District Visitor Centre

Experience the great outdoors with a boat trip and bike ride. The Lake District Visitor Centre at Brockhole is a great place to start your exciting adventure or leisurely trip. Entry to the house, grounds and lakeshore is free. You can hire bikes here if you haven't brought your own. Grab refreshments in the café to get you started or to take with you for a picnic.

Arrive by bus 555 or 599 or park here all day.



Stretch your legs

Take a walk through the pretty Arts and Crafts garden, designed by Thomas Mawson, on a path suitable for all. With views of Windermere and the Langdale Pikes, this is a garden with a magnificent backdrop. Across the National Park there are many more routes suitable for pushchairs or wheelchairs, visit www.lakedistrict.gov.uk/ miles without stiles.

Hop on the Bike Boat

Leave the crowds behind and head to the quieter western side of the lake on the bike boat. It usually runs on weekends May - Sept and daily in school holidays. There's space for up to 12 bikes and it leaves every 20 minutes. It's fun and easy - sit back and enjoy the views.

Wray Castle

If the weather takes a turn for the worse, pop in to Wray Castle (National Trust). This fantastic fortress is a family favourite. The rooms are empty of grand possessions, leaving plenty of room for dressing up and story-telling!



In summer, the boat arrives at Wray Jetty, and from here you can start walking or cycling right away! Follow the signed path up through the castle grounds and along the lake shore to Harrowslack for fantastic views and great picnic spots. It is 4 miles (7 km) each way, a round trip will take about 2 hours. Take Ordnance Survey Explorer map OL7. For more information on boat times:

Fun in the sun at Fell Foot

At the very southern tip of Lake Windermere, Fell Foot Park is a great place to play, explore and relax. At this National Trust lakeshore park there's plenty of space for games, picnics and gentle walks. The adventure playground with climbing frames and scramble nets is fun for all ages, or follow the tree trail around the park. Getting here

Arrive by bus, it's a short journey from Bowness-on-Windermere! The number 6 bus from Windermere and Bowness-on-Windermere runs all year. If you are coming from the south of Windermere, Fell Foot is just 10 mins by boat from Lakeside.

Anyone for Ice Cream?


